EMERGENCY PROGRAM MANAGER: The Emergency Manager is the lead emergency management professional for Lane County, responsible for managing and leading the County's office of Emergency Management. The Emergency Manager assists and supports all County departments by planning and directing emergency management activities and projects. This position collaborates with public and private sector partners to conduct and coordinate countywide preparedness, response, and recovery activities; and updates and maintains the County's comprehensive Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), as well as multi-year training and exercise schedules. This position is located within County Administration, and works under the daily direction of the Assistant Public Works Director.

SALARY & BENEFITS: The salary range for this position is \$68,723.20 - \$103,084.80 per year. As a full-time, regular employee, benefits options include:

- A Wellness Clinic available to eligible employees and their dependents.
